The olfactory, optic and vestibulocochlear nerves are entirely sensory; the oculomotor, trochlear, abducent, accessory and hypoglossal nerves are entirely motor, and the remaining nerves are mixed nerves. The MOTOR or EFFERENT fibers of cranial nerves arise from groups of neurons in the brain, which are their nuclei of origin.

THE CRANIAL NERVES The twelve pairs of cranial nerves are continuous with the brain and are numbered from anterior to posterior, according to their attachments to the brain. CN-I is attached to the cerebral hemispheres. CN-II is attached to the central cerebrum via the optic chiasma (hypothalamus), CN-III and IV to the midbrain.

### **The Nervous System: The Brain and Cranial Nerves**

Cranial nerves are the nerves that emerge directly from the brain (including the brainstem), in contrast to spinal nerves (which emerge from segments of the spinal cord). 10 of the cranial nerves originate in the brainstem. Cranial nerves relay information between the brain and parts of the body, primarily to and from regions of the head and neck.
